CPAA Hosts Pet Vaccine Clinic Feb. 4 at Dairy Delights in Etters

The Central Pennsylvania Animal Alliance (CPAA) will hold a first-come, first-served low-cost vaccine and micro-chipping clinic for cats and dogs on Saturday, Feb 4, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Dairy Delights, 320 Newberry Commons, in Etters.

Rabies, Distemper, and Bordetella (kennel cough) vaccines will be offered for \$10 each. AVID micro-chipping will be available for \$25, which includes the registration fee. All dogs should be on a short leash (martingale collars are suggested) and cats in a secure pet carrier. **BREEDERS WILL NOT BE SERVICED**

Food will be for sale by students from Crossroads Middle School. The proceeds from the food sale will help pay for an educational trip.
